*The E. F. Johnson Foundation was established in the 1960's by the Johnson Family for the purpose of funding scholarships and other worthwhile projects in the Waseca area. After the sale of E.F. Johnson Company the fund was held by others, and WAF served on the grants committee for the fund. In 2007, the E.F. Johnson Foundation was transferred to the Waseca Area Foundation Family of Funds, and the grants are advised by the Waseca Area Foundation board of directors according to the guidelines set forth by the Johnson family.
